Tonight, this award is bestowed upon another individual who has served the process service industry with distinction and honor—a person with strong leadership skills and the desire to help others.

One morning, 24 years ago, while at his desk scanning through a legal newspaper, he read that legislation was being proposed to allow service of a federal court summons and complaint by certified mail in lieu of personal service. This legislation had already been approved by the United States Supreme Court and was

on its way to Congress for final adoption. But our honoree knew that if this proposed legislation were to become law, it would be the beginning of the end for private process servers.

He immediately sprung into action and assembled a handful of individuals—and all the money they could scrape together—in order to take their fight to the nation's capitol. As a direct result of their efforts Congress halted the proposed legislation.

It was under his leadership, with the support of others, that NAPPS was formed and consummated. As one of the founding members, he helped write the original bylaws and served as Legislative Committee chair during the early years of the Association's development and growth. While these important attributes are on display in his resume, he never has forgotten that most important of life's values—family. A devoted father of nine children, he and his wife currently enjoy a wonderful personal and professional partnership while working together in the same industry.
